Phalaenopsis Busting Out All Over

Phalaenopsis, sometimes referred to as the moth orchid, is one of the favorites of backyard growers. The plants do well in the locale climes (75 to 85 degrees), prefer low to medium light, and humidity in the 50 to 80 percent range. Watering is critical as phals have no major water storage organs other than their leaves. Plants should be thoroughly watered then not watered again until nearly dry.
